

Child Access Routing Plan 2016 – 2017

Throughout the 2016 - 2017 school year, Naples Elementary School will serve approximately 700 kindergarten through fifth grade students. Currently students outside the parent responsibility zone of a mile-and-a-half of the school and on the west side of highway 40 are being bused.

Naples Elementary School is located in a rural section of Uintah County. Hazardous road conditions exist within our mile-and-a-half "Parent Responsibility Zone" on the west side of highway 40 which makes travel to and from school, by foot or by bicycle, unsafe. Because of the unsafe travel conditions within this "Parent Responsibility Zone," Naples School proposes that students within our mile-and-a-half "Parent Responsibility Zone" and living on the west side of highway 40 continue to be transported by school district bus to and from school. Students residing on the east side of Highway 40, and north of the 7-Eleven store on the corner of 2500 South and highway 40, can walk along the sidewalk to Naples School.

Students Who Walk or Ride Bicycles To/From School:

Students who ride bicycles to school enter the school grounds by way of a sidewalk that runs from the north or south side of 1900 South. Once on the school parking property, these students must get off their bicycles and walk them to the east of the building, to the bike rack located on the east side of school by the front entryway.

At the end of a school day, students riding bicycles are to wait at the bike rack until buses have left school grounds. Students then walk their bicycles along the route they used that morning, until off school grounds. Students who walk to school are to stay on sidewalks and use the school crossing when crossing the street.

Students Who Ride Buses To/From School:

Bus drivers provide students with rules/procedures to follow to ensure safe travel to/from bus stops. Upon arriving at school, bus students are to walk directly from the buses and into the gym/cafeteria area. Students may then either participate in the breakfast program or continue through the cafeteria and out to the playground.

At the end of each school day, all students are to follow teachers' directions for exiting the school in an orderly fashion.

All handicap-accessible buses will drop off and pick up students in the same area as all other students.

Students Who Ride In Cars To/From School:

Before school, parents/guardians are to deliver students to the sidewalk located in front of the school. Students are to walk into the school through the front doors.

After school, students scheduled to be picked up by parents/guardians exit the building with their class and walk directly to the sidewalk located in front of the school. Parents are to pick up their children there. The principal, a teacher, or a child's parent may escort a student through the parking lot to his/ her car.

The Naples Community Council has read and approved this routing plan for the 2016 - 2017 school year.
